SWISS RADIO BROADCASTS.

Members are reminded that the regular bi-weekly radio broadcasts from Switzerland still come through on Tuesdays and Saturdays at 8 p.m. on wavelength 25.61. Recent receptions have been very good and the programmes are excellent. On Tuesdays they are regularly in English, while changes have recently been made in the Saturday programmes, in that the first half is now in English and only the second half in the three national languages. There is no doubt that Swiss listeners in New Zealand will approve of this change. There is always plenty of good popular Swiss music.

On the occasion of last Saturday's broadcast (23rd February) the reception was good from beginning to end, and some very interesting topical talks on current political problems in Switzerland were given, but there was no spoken correspondence because, in the words of the announcer "the mail box was empty". In other words, no requests had been made for the transmission of greetings. The announcer explained that this falling-off was very probably due to the quick air mail service which now operates between Switzerland and New Zealand, but in any case he gave the assurance that they would like to continue this service in order to maintain close personal contact between Swiss people in New Zealand and their relatives and friends in Switzerland. Our fellow countrymen in New Zealand who desire to receive greetings from Switzerland should write to their relatives to send applications to the Swiss Broadcasting Corporation, Neuengasse 30, Berne.
