Obituary

ALOIS BEELER

On Sunday, January 3, Mr Alois Beeler, aged 72, of Hawera, passed away.

Mr Beeler arrived in New Zealand with his parents and sister in 1913. He was born at Iback Schwyz, his father at Steinen and his mother at Ingenbohl.

The family started farming at Manaia, then took on a lease for 12 years, sold out and then came to Hawera in 1931, to retire. The father and son went to Switzerland for a trip, being away for seven months. After they came back they bought a farm of 120 acres at Hawera.

The family made a great success of farming. The father passing away in 1941 and the mother in 1956.

Alois always took a big interest in the affairs of the old country. He had subscribed regularly to the Swiss paper Bote.

Not only was Alois Beeler a good Swiss, but also an excellent New Zealander.

We extend to his sister Rosa, our deepest sympathy in her sad loss.
