HONOURING HANS WALTER SCHNELLER

Recently a concert was held in Zurich in the honour of the late yodelsongs composer Hans Walter Schneller (1893-1982). During the 1940's and 1950's, Hans Walter Schneller composed well over 200 yodelsongs and thus became one of the best and most popular composers in his field. In commemoration of his one hundredth birthday, his widow financed a special concert for over 750 spectators at the Limmat Hotel in Zurich in honour of her late husband.

For this occasion most people turned up in national costumes. The performers came from the three Zurich choirs which Schneller had conducted for over 30 years.

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
