Entertainment was also not lacking, with the Swiss-Kiwi Yodel Group and music group. We were able to enjoy several songs, a lovely duet, alphorn blowing and playing of the "Hackbrett". During a break, we were also given a great performance of "Fahnenschwingen" by a long-standing Club member, Mr. Joe Egger. This was followed by another, more light-hearted item, by the Yodel Group. This wonderful entertainment was followed by a short address by our President, Herbert Staheli, and then by the Ambassador. Mr. Thurnheer commented that if the Club continued in its same vein in the future, it would one day surely be able to celebrate its 100th Jubilee. Well, that may be, but I think we'll leave that one to our grandchildren!

A mouth-watering Jubilee Cake was then presented in the form of a delicious "Zugerkirschtorte", made by Werner Burri.
