Ueli Luginbühl 1951 - 1999

Ulrich Hans Luginbuhl or Ueli as we know him was born on the 3rd of July 1951 in Strengelbach (Aargau). He was the son of Margrit and Heinz and brother to Helga and Mark. Ueli went to school in Zofingen for 9 years, and then his family moved to Frick when Ueli was 16. He joined the soccer club there and was a very talented young player. Local people welcomed him into their circle of friends. Ueli was very much liked, as he was gifted with a special sense of humour.

Ueli went on to do a 4 year apprenticeship in printing, a profession he was proud of, excelled at and one in which he always strived for perfection. When he was 20, at the "Jungbuergeraufnahme" - the local 'coming of age

celebration' - he met his girlfriend, Maria. They soon found out that both of them wished to travel. But first only as far as Lucerne in 1971, and there they worked hard to save money and focus on plans for travelling further together.

In 1975, Ueli and Maria bought a VW van and converted it to a campervan. They shipped it to New York and started their - for this time unusual journey - through North and South America. Ueli had many stories to tell about this time. After nearly 3 years, in 1978, they returned to Switzerland with the campervan, happy and healthy, much to the relief of their parents.

In 1979, they were off again to the USA for a year, travelling and working. In 1981, they were off again to USA and bought a campervan there. Ueli and Maria visited more states including Alaska, where they

stayed for 3 months. When in South America, up in the Andes, they had met a Dutch couple on

their honeymoon, and thought, that now they could do something similar, - not getting married, but trying to see part of the world on a push bike. So they sold the van and bought bicycles, a tent and all the equipment needed. They left for Hawaiian Islands, toured around Fiji, the North and South Island of New Zealand, plus eastern Australia. The Aussies thought that they were crazy, because again, travelling on a push bike was very uncommon for that time. They were pretty fit then and

had to buy wider shorts to give their growing muscles more space.

In 1984 Ueli got a job offer as an offset printer in Auckland and straight away left Switzerland with his partner Maria to settle in New Zealand for a while. This while lasted up until now, interrupted by frequent longer visits to Switzerland and a 2 year stay in Australia. On the latest combined visiting and business trip to Switzerland, he became suddenly ill and, believing that he had a burst appendix, was immediately admitted to hospital. But the doctors found a very rare tumour that pressed on his stomach. After the operation, his appetite for food was gone and within the two months from the operation in Switzerland to his death in Auckland Hospital he lost about 30 kilos.

Ueli's passion, besides his business and being together with Maria, included enjoying short trips around Auckland, watching european soccer, going to speedway races, playing with children, meeting now and then with his printer mates at the RSA, spending time with friends and once in a while a tennis or table tennis match. In recent years, Ueli became more active in the Auckland Swiss Club. He liked helping out with work on the farm whenever possible and he certainly enjoyed the companionship.

We will always remember Ueli's playful and entertaining personality together with his quieter more sensitive and thoughtful side.

Report / Swiss Abroad Congress

At the autumn Session of the Council of the Swiss Abroad (CSA) the Delegates unanimously accepted a resolution, that the seven sectarian contracts with the EU be ratified (by the Federal Parliament) as early as possible.
