88th Auslandschweizer-Kongress, 20-22 August, St Gallen

The theme of the conference was one fundamental to Swiss society – democracy – and more particularly, how the interests of Swiss nationals living abroad can be better and more directly represented in political decision-making in their homeland. Some 130,000 of the nearly 700,000 Swiss Abroad are enrolled to vote – that's the equivalent of a Canton like Neuenberg. Yet because the issues which generally impact directly on them are spread across a number of Government Departments, there is little focus on the particular concerns that affect Swiss abroad..

This topic had already been introduced at the Auslandschweizerat in March, so at this sitting papers were presented which progressed the thinking. Topics included:

- the form of new legislation that would be required and how to progress that;
- the appropriate part of the political system to be represented in (directly in the Bundesrat, or as a 27th canton?);
- what changes would be required in the Auslandschweizerorganisation and in Swiss clubs and societies internationally, to legitimise their voice; and
- e-voting.

The idea of a 27th canton was dismissed as being not viable politically or practically. The Rat voted to continue work on developing legislation that recognises the political rights of Ausland Schweiz.

On the political front, President of the AuslandSchweiz Parliamentary Group Filippo Lombardi and Foreign Affairs Minister Micheline Calmy-Rey were supportive, with Calmy-Rey undertaking to set up an Interdepartmental Working Group to look at the coordination of Departments on matters affecting Swiss Abroad, and at the development of new legislation.

Another critical part of such a future was also launched at the Conference: the SwissCommunity.org website which is a platform linking Swiss abroad with each other and their home country. Not e-voting – but a major e-step!
