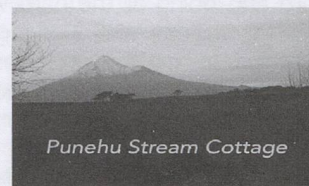

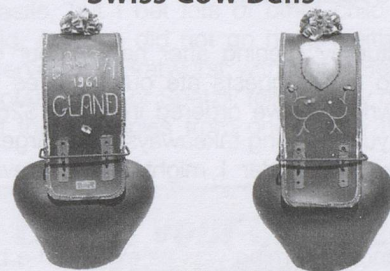
8 August - National Day Dinner

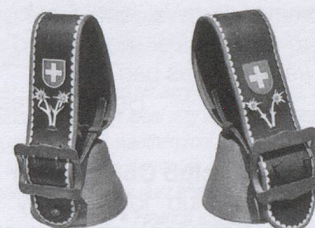
