Battle of Morgarten Celebration

Dalí canvas-inspired circus to delight New Zealand Festival goers 'Like a firework, a scenic extravaganza, scenes of sheer beauty, with precise stage lighting, amazing costumes and breathtaking acrobatic acts.' – 24 Heures, Lausanne

A surreal Swiss circus is set to transform Wellington's Opera House over six nights in March with a spectacular show that mimics the interior world of a Salvador Dalí painting. La Verità is an "acrobatic and surrealist poem" that will star 13 performers equally adept in acrobatics, theatre, dance and music - against the backdrop of a giant (nine metre x 15 metre) Dalí canvas. The original of the stunning backdrop was created by Dalí for the ballet Mad Tristan put on by New York's Metropolitan Opera in 1944 and loaned to La Verità writer and director Daniele Finzi Pasca by a private art collector in 2010.

Finzi Pasca has said La Verità appeals more to the lightness of our natures than the darker qualities that can feature in the work of the world's most famous surrealist. "Dalí is inspired by nightmare, while our gaze is always charmed, inspired by dreams. This will not be the truth according to Dalí, but the truth inspired by Dalí."

New Zealand Festival's Artistic Director Shelagh Magadza says this enchanting show is brought to the Festival by a director and company working at the height of their creative powers. La Verità's multitalented performers are absolutely first class. Daniele Finzi Pasca created, staged and choreographed two Olympic closing ceremonies and wrote and directed Cirque du Soleil's Corteo. Since its premiere in Montreal in January 2013, La Verità has been seen by over 250,000 people.
