

Of the seventeen professional groups which comprise the total display by some 2200 exhibitors at the Swiss Industries Fair in Basle, the textile group has always been from the very beginning one of those with the largest number of exhibitors and arousing the most interest. Once again during the 36th Swiss Industries Fair from 19th to 29th April 1952, this group will be strongly represented by over 200 exhibitors.

But it will not only be the number of exhibitors but rather the importance of the display both for the home and foreign markets that will make the textile industry one of the most prominent groups at the Fair. The textile industry itself is the oldest export industry in Switzerland and its products are appreciated throughout the world's markets. In the last few years the value of Swiss textile exports exceeded Fr. 500 million per annum, and it is therefore not surprising that each year the textile group arouses such great interest in visitors from abroad.

One of the particular attractions of the textile group is the original and tasteful manner in which the various exhibits are displayed, which naturally does not mean that the other exhibiting groups are not equally successful in presenting their own products in an attractive manner. However, each product has its own special way in which it is presented and, in making such comparisons, it is more correct to speak of different kinds of beauty rather than different grades. In the industrial sections the beauty of the exhibits strikes us in the clear proportions of the shapes of the machinery each formed with a view to serving a specific purpose. In Hall II on the other hand, and in the 4-storey Hall II B harbouring the textile and footwear exhibits, there is beauty of another kind, mainly represented by inventive imagination, which decides the thousand-fold variations in colour and designs of the materials, laces and embroideries, and the fashionable cut of dresses and clothes. It also decides the manner of presentation in the different stands, the arrangement of the folds of material and the harmony of colours.

For many years the particular attraction of the textile exhibit has been a special display called «Creation» in which leading Swiss export manufacturers, together with associations of the textile and footwear industries, present their most beautiful products for special inspection. The fashionable novelties offered here are classified together in a comprehensive artistic scheme calculated to reveal the various exhibits at their very best in a symphony of form and colour.



In close collaboration with the exhibiting associations and manufacturers, Mr. Rolf Rappaz will entirely redesign the Creation pavilion for the coming Fair, and the change in the manner of presentation will emphasize the novelty of the goods exhibited. I am convinced that the special display called « Crédit » will once again be one of the greatest attractions at the Fair and, in its new form, will earn praise and recognition both from experts and the general public.

The present issue of *Textiles Suisses* provides, together with the list of exhibitors and various illustrated articles, a most valuable pre-view of the variety of the textile goods to be offered at the Swiss Industries Fair, and it will certainly arouse in its readers the wish to examine the full range of the exhibits at the Fair itself and thus to obtain personal contact with the numerous exhibitors. Considering that, in the last few years, the number of visitors from abroad has increased so considerably, I am convinced that this year again the textile display at the Swiss Industries Fair will prove an irresistible attraction for visitors both from home and abroad.

In the name of the exhibitors I offer to those interested in all parts of the world a most cordial invitation to visit the Swiss Industries Fair 1952.
