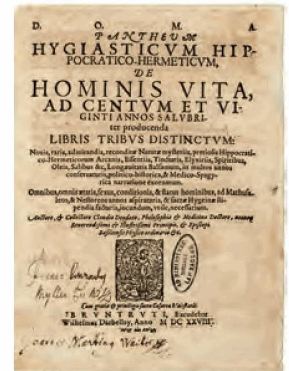

Archives and collections

ZBINDEN, Emil (1908–1991): The archive of Emil Zbinden – the woodcut artist par excellence – contains not only originals and prints but also printing blocks made of wood and metal, his personal library and his work library, correspondence as well as a selection of his working tools. (gift of Karl and Katharina Zbinden-Bärtschi)

ZÜST, Andreas (1947–2000): The portrait archive of the photographer, practitioner of the “total work of art”, natural scientist and publisher Andreas Züst contains analogue photographs, slides, contact sheets, black and white and colour negatives from the 1970s to the 1990s as well as DVDs, digital data and extensive documentation of his work. MOSSET, Olivier and Dominique Uldry, *Kramgasse 61*, edition consisting of 8 plates, 2012. Ceiling fresco of an old town house as a memory of a childhood in Bern.

MURPHY, John, *Cut from the visible*, edition consisting of 4 silk-screen prints on paper, Ed. Gevaert, 2008. Specially produced cinema book cover in a luxury box.

POZAREK, Vaclav, *LOS, Library of Sculpture*, consisting of 35 drawings, 2006–2011. A series of typographical studies.

SANTORO, Vittorio, *Silence Destroys Consequences*, artist's book, chez Yvon Lambert, 2012. Documentation of a global letter-writing project.

STAUCH, Dominik, *Showdown*, edition consisting of 16 plates, 2008. A series of portraits of major rock idols.

ULDRY, Dominique, *Wo endet die Stadt?* 15 photographs, 2010–2011. A photographic study of the urbanised outskirts of Bern.

AMMANN, Egon (*1941): Publisher's archive containing full documentation on book production, including licensed editions, correspondence with authors and other materials from the collaboration with the authors: proofreading correspondence as well as galley proofs, production documents and reviews of published works. Also contains business documents dating from the firm's foundation, including original contracts and fee statements as well as accounts and company files.

BELTRAMETTI, Franco (1937–1995): Complete literary estate with drafts and early versions of the works, research materials, reviews, correspondence, personal notebooks, editions of books and publications. (received from the Fondazione Franco Beltrametti)

BINDE, Ruth (*1932): Autograph collection belonging to the cultural educator and former employee of Diogenes-Verlag.

BORGEAUD, Georges (1914–1998): Typescript entitled *Courtiser Paris*, 23.04.1949. (gift of Marianne Rosselet)

–: around 70 handwritten, signed letters and cards, photographs, press cuttings, documentary materials. (gift of Christiane de Lavallaz)

BURREN, Ernst (*1944): Complete archive including manuscripts and typescript versions, literary and personal correspondence, personal documents and photos, deeds and prizes as well as a complete collection of reviews, specimen copies, audiovisual documents and presentation copies.

CENDRARS, Blaise (1887–1961): Correspondence between Blaise Cendrars and Guy Tosi, his publisher at Denoël, from 1946 to 1961. Also a collection of letters, manuscripts and photos documenting the preparations for a Cendrars exhibition staged by Tosi in Florence in May 1961. They include dedications from Cocteau, Milhaud, Miller, Peisson, Picon and Soupault.

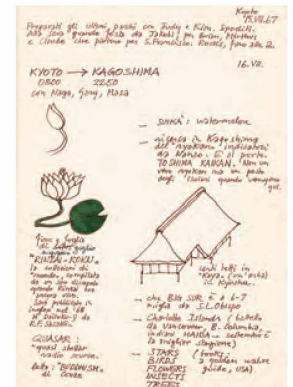

DÜRRENMATT, Friedrich (1921–1990): Typescript of *Die Panne* with handwritten corrections.

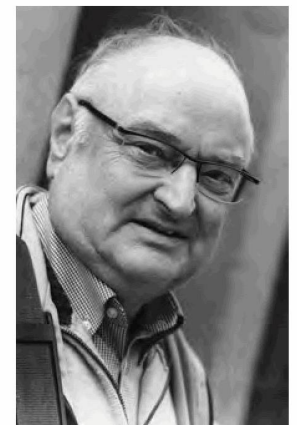

Contains manuscripts and typescripts, literary and personal correspondence, the Ball/Hennings authors' library, substantial photographic holdings and personal documents, a collection of published journalism and a collection of reviews by Ball and Hennings.
