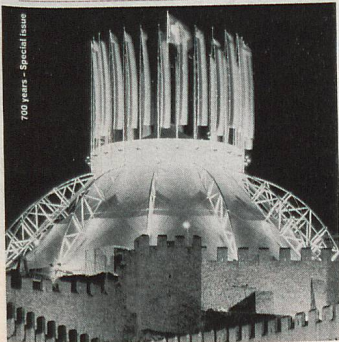

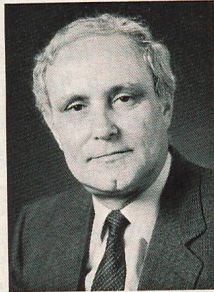

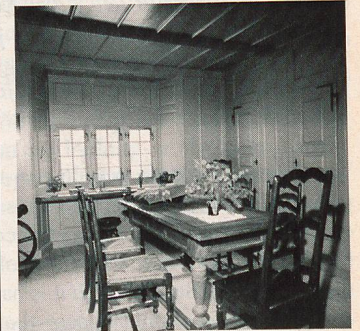

But throughout all these festivals and rejoicings let us not forget that we are not only Swiss but at the same time Europeans and citizens of this world.

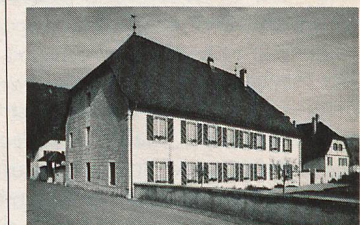
