New Federal Constitution

Modified article on Swiss abroad

The upcoming popular referendum on constitutional reform on 18 April 1999 is of particular interest for the Fifth Switzerland, since it also proposes a rewording of Article 45bis., which has been in force since 1966 and defines the constitutional relationship between the Confederation and the Fifth Switzerland.

Under proposed the amendment, Article 40 now contains the following sentences: "1The Confederation promotes relations between **Swiss** Abroad and among themselves

with Switzerland. It is entitled to support organisations which pursue this objective. ²It enacts provisions governing the rights and obligations of Swiss Abroad, in particular with respect to the exercise of political rights within the Confederation, the performance of military or civil obligations, and the provision of support and social security insurance."

In contrast to the existing article governing the Swiss Abroad, this new formulation improves the legal status of the Fifth Switzerland by expressly laying down the Confederation's social commitment to its citizens abroad. The concerns expressed by the ASO in its statement on the constitutional reform have been taken into account in the modified article. As a result, the sensitive subject of social security insurance would henceforth be incorporated in the wording. In particular, the concept of a voluntary old age and survivors' insurance and disability insurance (AHV/IV) has been embedded more firmly in the constitution.

SRI via satellite and Internet

Since 1 January this year SRI has been broadcasting its German and English-language programmes throughout Europe via Astra Digital Radio (ADR) as well as short wave.

"Digital satellite technology is significantly cheaper than analog. Because of this, we decided over a year ago to dispose of our analog channels by the end of 1998," says Paul Badertscher, Technical Head of SRI, citing the reason behind this move. "Added to this," he continues, "ADR is very well established in the European market."

Indeed, more than 90 European radio channels can be received via ADR. In line with this rapid spread, the prices for digital receivers have dropped sharply in recent months. Since more and more radio stations are broadcasting via ADR, listeners will soon be forced to change to a new receiver.

From May this year the French-language programme

will also be broadcast in digital form only, via the Eutelsat Hotbird 3 satellite. The analog channel on Hotbird 1 is being discontinued. The Italian-language programme is already broadcast only via Hotbird 3. At the same time, however, SRI continues to broadcast via short wave. Ask for our programme

The European integration of Switzerland

"Switzerland – Europe". This year's Congress of the Swiss Abroad will be devoted to a highly topical issue: the process of Swiss integration in the European Union (EU).

Tollowing four years of negotiations, the bilateral agreement between the EU and Switzerland was concluded on 11 December 1998. The successful outcome was announced in the celebrated ceremonial hall of Vienna's Hofburg Palace.

Agreement on the seven dossiers represents a historic event for Switzerland. This significant move marking the beginning of a new relationship with Europe is reason enough to devote the 77th Congress of the Swiss Abroad to the discussion of Switzerland's further steps towards integration. After all, it also has major implications for the Fifth Switzerland, particularly concerning personal mobility. Moreover, follow-

ing conclusion of the bilateral agreement the Federal Council declared that this would in no way alter the strategic goal of EU membership.

But the Congress of the Swiss Abroad, to be held in Lausanne from 6 to 8 August, is more than just a meeting of specialists and a forum for exchanging ideas. Our programme also offers participants the unique opportunity of attending a very special cultural event: the Fête des Vignerons, a traditional folk festival held only four times each century.
