Consulate/Embassy: Position of Honorary Consul, Perth, Jan 2016 The Embassy of Switzerland in Canberra is seeking qualified candidates interested in taking over the position of "Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Perth" from January 2016. The appointment for this honorary position will be made by the Head of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs of Switzerland. Before the function can be exercised, however, Honorary Consuls must be formally accepted by the Australian Government. Such acceptance is constituted by the exequatur issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

Mandate: The Honorary Consul is the local representative in Perth of the Embassy of Switzerland in Canberra and the Consulate General of Switzerland in Sydney.

Functions: The Honorary Consul acts as an agent to the local authorities as well as business, scientific, cultural circles and the Swiss community, He/she will:

- Represent and promote the image of Switzerland.
- Maintain useful and harmonious ties with local authorities and the business community as well as scientific and cultural circles.
- Inform the Embassy and the Consulate General of business opportunities, of interesting projects in relation to science, culture and tourism and to promote Switzerland at events in cooperation with relevant partner organizations.
- Provide information to interested persons.
- Support the Embassy and the Consulate General to organize official visits to Perth.
- Promote solidarity within the Swiss community and its ties with Switzerland.
- In agreement with the Consulate General, assist Swiss citizens in need of help

Profile: You are a Swiss national with close links to Switzerland. Your professional activity is compatible with the mandate of an Honorary Consul. You have an established network in the fields of business, politics, science and culture as well as good contacts with local authori-

ties and the Swiss community. You speak at least one Swiss national language fluently and you are interested in taking on the position for a minimum of four years. You are able to provide free of charge the infrastructure (office space, telephone/fax/internet access, administrative services) in order to carry out your official duties. An allowance will be paid to cover expenses in connection with the mandate.

The following year a small group of men rehearsed at Café D'Lish in Deakin. After the rehearsal the boys were spoilt with Peter's famous Crèmeschnitten (vanilla slices - now officially recognized as the best in town).

The anthem sounded good with the extra support. No wonder that a year later more club members, including women, wanted to participate in the rehearsals and of course the sweet treats afterwards. Singing was fun. The group decided to come together more often to sing well known Swiss folk songs.

Charlotte Hummel organized for the Swiss choir to participate in the Dreiländereck Konzert 2009 together with the long established Austrian and German choirs. This was a time when expert guidance was needed and the enthusiastic Geoff Roberts became the conductor with the talented Sandra Lo as piano accompanist. The concert was a success. The audience was intrigued by the freshness of the choir, the traditional milkers shirts (Sennechutteli) and cow bells and a milk bowl with a rotating silver coin (Talerschwingen) producing a unique Swiss sound.

Of course, the choir needed a name. Reflecting its origins, it became the Crèmeschnitte Chörli. Now accompanied by the dedicated Shirley Cramp, the choir has since participated in many Swiss Club events, at the 2014 Sängerfest in Canberra, at concerts with the Austrian and German choirs, and has sung at the Swiss Embassy and at nursing homes. The choir rehearses regularly, having fun while singing with friends and bringing pleasure to its audiences.

Swiss Historical Society

This is my final report on behalf of the Swiss Historical Society. The Society was established in 2007 with the dual aim of researching the history of the Swiss communities in New South Wales and of publishing a book based on this research. During the eight years of its existence, the Society not only completed the tasks it was designed to carry out, but also managed to secure a permanent archive for the historic records of the various Swiss community organisations in this state; these valuable documents and photos are now in the collection of the State Library of New South Wales.

Earlier this year, the beautiful silk flag made for the Swiss Society of New South Wales – the forerunner of the Swiss Club of New South Wales – found a new home in the offices of the Consulate General of Switzerland in Bondi Junction, Sydney. And the Swiss-themed objects which were created for community events in former times, such as the cast-iron candlesticks and the wooden shields decorated with female figures in traditional costumes, are once again looked after and used as appropriate by the Swiss Club.

Although the Swiss Historical Society will cease to exist, sales of the remaining copies of "The Swiss in New South Wales: A History" will continue while stocks last, and profits from the sales will be transferred to the Swiss Community Care Society.

As I sign off as president, I would like to thank all the people who contributed to our project over the years, especially my hardworking and loyal committee members Armin Roth, Norbert Schweizer, Alois Kretz, Margrit Bachmann, Ursula Schappi, Elizabeth Isele, Peter Meuri and Tomas Drevikovsky. Thanks are also due to Consuls General Juerg Casserini, Markus Meli and Ernst Steinmann and their colleagues at the Consulate General for their continued support and to Sonja and Norbert Schweizer for making their home available for our meetings
