RECORD FLIGHT BY SWISSAIR DC-8

A Swissair DC-8 airliner has set a new world distance flight record by flying 7460 miles non-stop from Long Beach, California, to Beirut, Lebanon.

The airliner, Swissair's fourth and newest DC-8, Series 53, covered this distance on the first leg of its delivery flight on October 31. It flew a total of 7896 miles in just under 14 hours.

Piloted by a Swiss crew, the aircraft averaged a ground speed of 565 m.p.h. at heights which varied between 33,000 and 42,000 feet. Top speed, achieved with an average tail wind of 50 m.p.h., was 690 m.p.h.

The new DC-8 is powered by four Pratt & Whitney JT3D-3B fan engines of the latest type, and can carry 142 passengers, comprising 16 in first class and 126 in economy class. Swissair will use the aircraft on its North Atlantic services, providing non-stop flights under all weather conditions between Switzerland and the United States.

● RECIPE

LEMON DRINK

4lbs sugar, 1oz citric acid, 1oz tartaric acid, 1oz epsom salt: mix these ingredients.
