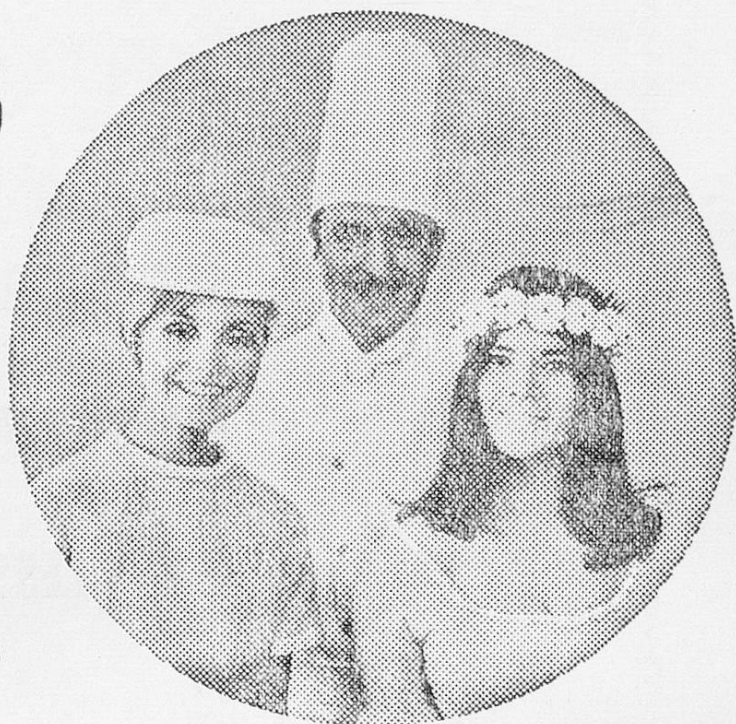

- Wed. 26 to Sat. 29: Accommodation at the Miramar Hotel with transfers and with a half day sightseeing tour of Hong Kong Island.
- Sat. 29: Hong Kong-Zurich. SR 309, Swissair Coronado.
Departs 8 a.m. Arrives 7.30 p.m.

AUGUST 1971

- Tues. 3: Zurich-New York. SR 100, Swissair Boeing 747
Departs 12 Midday. Arrives 2.50 p.m.
- Tues. 3 to Wed. 4: Accommodation Bristol Hotel with transfers with a half day tour of Manhattan Island.
- Wed. 4: New York-Los Angeles. UA 17, United DC 8
Departs 5 p.m. Arrives 8 p.m.
- Wed. 4 to Thurs. 5: Accommodation at the Hayward Hotel with transfers. (Suggested visit to Disneyland—cost not included.)
