POLITICAL NEWS

In conjunction with the recently introduced voting rights for Swiss abroad, the Swiss Embassy in Wellington has kindly sent some interesting new statistics.

According to these statistics, the number of Swiss abroad, as per the end of June 1992, is 491,614 of whom 337,347 or 69% have a double nationality. Of this total 380,429 are over the age of 18 and therefore entitled to vote.

The countries with the largest Swiss communities are:

57% of all Swiss abroad live in countries of the European Community.
