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Hours of prickly work. Hundreds of flowering roses are stitched into the train of this evening gown.

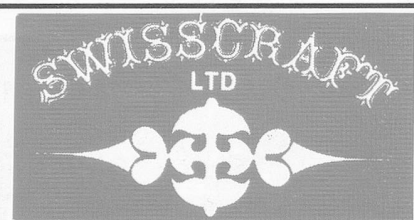
WORLD RENOWNED FLORAL DESIGNER
