FRENCH SWISS ANGRY WITH SWISSAIR

To save costs, Swissair has decided to concentrate all its long-haul flights on Zurich airport alone. As far as Swissair goes, apart from short-haul European flights, Geneva will from now on be connected to all other continents only by feeder services via Zurich. This of course has angered not only Geneva but all French speaking cantons who consider this move as one more slap in their face by their German Swiss counterparts.

The "Association Genève-Cointrin" which defends the interest of the Geneva Airport has reacted very violently. In a full page advertisement, it sarcastically asked Swissair: If you feel it necessary to cancel all intercontinental flights in and out of Geneva airport to save money, will you also do away with your aircraft jet engines in order to save fuel? It also asked every reader to cut out this advertisement and send it to the Managing Director of Swissair.

Through Swissair's move, Geneva, headquarters for over 280 worldwide institutions (UN, International Labour Office, International Red Cross etc, to name a few) feels that its position as a world centre is being put into jeopardy.

In retaliation the "Association Genève-Cointrin" is demanding total freedom from the Swiss Government to negotiate traffic rights for as many overseas airlines as possible to land in Geneva withough Swissair being allowed to make opposition, since Swissair no longer flies from Geneva to such countries.

Unfortunately, it seems that the famous "Röstigraben" between the German and the French Swiss is widening.
