Foreigners currently account for about 19 % of the population.

The Sonntagsblick, tabloid newspaper says there are about 150,000 people working illegaly in Switzerland. The Swiss trade union federation looks upon this as very serious, because Switzerland has about 200,000 unemployed. Most of the illegal workers are employed in the catering industry, construction and agricultural industry. It is said that the use of illegal workers is pushing the salaries down and there is the call for the authorities to do more to punish the illegal workers.
