

Report from our Delegate to the Swiss Abroad

Last year I reported on the Federal Council's proposed changes to the voluntary AHV / IV Insurance scheme, changes that would have been very detrimental to most compatriots living abroad and interested to start or to continue paying into the scheme on a voluntary basis.

- Thanks to the Swiss Abroad Organisation (SAO) intervention, a timely rethink was initiated. According to the latest information to hand, the scheme will now not be scrapped as was proposed. The Federal Council recently presented new initiatives. The following improvements have been presented for discussions:
- 1) In states that do not have reciprocal Social Insurance agreements with Switzerland (e.g. New Zealand) there will be no time constraint to enter into the voluntary AHV / IV.
- 2) The present level of contributions will continue to be based on the income realised in the country of domicile.
- 3) For the dependents of compulsorily insured people as well as for Students, new proposals within the existing scheme are being researched.
- 4) Any person over 50 years of age at the time the revised scheme be-

comes law, including countries that have reciprocal agreements, can enter the voluntary AHV / IV up until retirement age. Several problems have yet to be sorted out and resolved. Since the definitive reforms have not yet been finalised, the SAO has not taken an official stand but is very active behind the scene to preserve the interests of the "Fifth Switzerland".

- The SAO has never been against AHV / IV reforms as such, it has however been fighting for a number of years for a revision that incorporates the legitimate needs of present and new emigrants. In particular it points out the fact that two thirds of insured women, including in countries with reciprocal agreements, have not adequate insurance possibilities. It can also reasonably be expected that some compatriots may, through no fault of their own, become dispossessed and may need some form or other of benevolent funding.
