Peter Weiss 1930 - 1999

+

Peter was born on the second Feb. 1930 in Männedorf near Zürich.

At the age of 6, Peter's father died and together with his 2 brothers he was brought up by his mother who remained an important figure throughout his life. Peter did all his Primary and Secondary schooling in Männedorf and after a short period at teachers training college in 1946 he started working on a farm. In 1948 he entered Agriculture College 'Strickhof' in Zürich, graduating with diploma in agriculture. Peter left Switzerland in 1950 and set off by bike on his first foreign venture, traveling and working on farms in Holland, Denmark and Sweden. He didn't like the cold climate in the far north, but it was in Denmark where he met someone who told him; "if you want to go farming you should go to New Zealand". Shortly after, Peter returned to Switzerland and worked in a home for young people. It was here he met his wife Margrit. - They decided to emigrate, first spending a year in England to learn some English.

- Margrit and Peter were married in 1958 and soon thereafter set out for New Zealand.

Arriving at Wellington they were greeted by Ruth and Hans Messmer.

- After milking cows for a year in the shadows of Mt Taranaki, they were offered a sharemilking job at Brophy's, where they remained until 1964. During this time three boys were born, Thomas, Martin and Sam. It was at that time that Peter had his sights on a farm at Pokuru near Te Awamutu. They moved to the new property in 1965 and it was there in 1967 that daughter Susanne was born.

A time of major change on the farm saw Peter taking up the challenge of growing maize. He did this with some success, winning a trophy for highest yield.

- Peter went on to work for and later managed Allied Grain Cooperative in Te Awamutu from which he retired in 1987. - In the meantime he had bought the "Hill Property" at Raglan in 1985 where he began several plantations of mixed native bush with exotic forests. He loved nature in all its form and lived there until his untimely death due to a road accident on June 5th. 1999.


Environment Award winning Swiss Farming Couple

The Swiss community of Hamilton and the Waikato have reason to feel very proud of Theresa & Joe Risi with Sharemilker son Stephen as this years winners of the Farm environment award. Joe and Theresa Risi are son and daughter-in-law of the late Walter and Marie Risi, cofounders of the Hamilton Swiss Club, and they together with son Stephen farm a 340-Cow dairy-farm (180 hectares) adjacent to Lake Karapiro near Cambridge.

- Reading in the June Dairy Exporter we learn that the much contested award is granted annually to the farm showing best profitability combined with sustainability of the environment.

Theresa and Joe took over the farm in 1982 and converted it from sheep to dairy having regard to the environmental impact of such a conversion. They have planted approx. 27 hectares of pine and native trees on parts of the farm less suitable for grazing dairy cows. Such plantations are environmentally friendly, giving protection from erosion, providing shelter for animals, and encouraging birdlife. As a long term investment, exotic species harvested periodically from such plantations can make the undertaking cost effective.



The Price of a Telegram

Many members will remember when we sent funny telegrams to be read out at weddings, and used telegrams because they were cheaper than toll calls.

In fact many businesses relied on the speed and efficiency of telegrams to advise prices, or confirm 'details' etc.

Then it cost a few pence (cents) per word. Today N.Z. Post operates the Telegram Company, and your completed form is either telephoned in or handed into the nearest Post Shop.

- However, you may be staggered by the costs;

Within N.Z. minimum charge for up to 100 words \$ 15.50, and each additional 50 words \$ 5.00

- However, "Urgent Telegrams" are sent only to Auckland, Wellington or Christchurch cost \$ 25.00 or \$ 40.00 if delivered on a Saturday. Note - no deliveries on Sunday. Delivery of your telegram to other than a pre-selected list of 16 main centres will be sent by Fastpost to reach people by the next working day, or if rural, may take longer. In other words - excuse the pun - one may as well send Fastpost letters. They do however set a 2 hour delivery target within the three main centres if sent

urgent on weekdays within business hours. It is certainly faster to telephone, send a Fax or E-mail and of course a lot cheaper. Overseas telegrams cost \$1.00 per word, and words of ten or more letters are charged as two words.
