

Francis Thomas Joseph (Tom) Gisler passed away Tuesday 4/1/00 peacefully at his home- 283 Tui Cres; Te Awamutu.

Tom was born in Thames on 28/5/1920 and was the eldest child of Frank and Katherine Gisler.

Frank Gisler arrived in New Zealand in 1909 from the Swiss region of Canton Uri as a cheese maker and worked in Eltham in Taranaki. He was transferred to the Thames area to start the Netherton cheese

factory. He met and married Katherine Quinn and bought a small dairy farm at Turua.

Tom was brought up on the farm and spent his early working days at the dairy factory. He served in both Egypt and Italy in WW2.

He arrived back in NZ and learned the sheep and beef farming trade on a farm in Miranda and then bought a sheep farm at Ellicotts Block out from Te Awamutu.

He married Pat Henderson and is survived by her and six children and 17 grand children. They retired from the farm in 1990.

A requiem mass was held for Tom at St. Patricks Catholic Church on 7/1/00.

May he rest in peace!
