Alfred Leo John Steiner

10 May 1921 – 13 March 2008

Alfred Leo John (Fredi) Steiner died In his 87th year. Up to a severe stroke two and a half years ago, he was a very strong and healthy man with still a full head of hair and his own teeth.

In 1942, he joined the New Zealand army and went into camp in Cambridge. He had his 21st birthday on the boat, the Aquitania, on the way to the Middle East. There he worked in a pie factory for the troops for a time. Then he went to Italy where he drove the ammunition trucks. At Monte Cassino his job was to feed the big guns. In the night he had to drive around dead people, donkeys and pot-holes in the dark, and he never had an accident.

At the end of the war, he went to the Swiss border. He told the Swiss border guards where his father came from (Baar) and his mother (Walchwil). There was great excitement, but the Swiss guards would not let him in.

He came home with the last lot of returning servicemen on 12th June 1947 to his parents, Karl and Pauline Steiner, and his four sisters and three brothers, to Springdale, Waitoa in the Waikato. He married Magdalena Mary Nolly.

In 1952 he and his wife shifted to Galatea, to a Rehab farm. The government provided these farms at a favourable rate to returned servicemen. He really loved the family and farm life. Fredi and Lena had two sons and three daughters, and later the family grew to eighteen grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.

Fredi had deer and pigs and built an aviary of fifty pens, where he had peafowl, ostriches, parrots of many kinds, budgies, canaries, pigeons, doves, finches, youldians, rosellas, quails, Java sparrows, black and white nun pigeons. Of course he had a herd of cows, too. He grew lots of lucerne, so that the cattle always had plenty of food.

Fredi altered the house and built swimming pools. He also helped build the RSA Club rooms and the Galatea Community Hall. He always kept himself busy. He and his wife went to Switzerland twice and had relatives come to New Zealand.

He had a great funeral, as he was well known. May he rest in peace. (written by MM Steiner)
