Anton made a trip back to Switzerland and married Kathy (Katie) Marty, from Kussnacht, SZ, before returning

with her to NZ in 1922. The three Stygers in NZ had, between them, 20 children, and eight of them married Swiss immigrants to NZ.

Kaspar Josef Kopp (Joe)



Joe was born at Beromünster on June 1st 1924. He was one of 9 children, 5 girls and 4 boys, him being the oldest of the boys. Joe's parents were farming on 4 hectares of their own land with some lease land near by. As a young boy he would have seen his parents battling to make ends meet and worse still he experienced the depression years in the Thirties. World War II was the next dark cloud on the horizon. In 1943 Joe was called up for Swiss army training followed by one year of active service. The following years saw Joe working on farms and as a truck driver for an industrial firm. On 15th November 1951 he emigrated, owing his passage to his future employer, the Hurley Family in Taranaki.

In 1962 Joe married Grace Buckwell and they started married life as farm workers at Hangatiki/Otorohanga. Over the next years the family grew by 4 girls and an adopted son. Then followed a time of sharemilking at Parawera until they managed to buy their own dairy farm at Korakonui near Te Awamutu. Joe and his family worked very hard to improve the farm, and to augment their income, Joe started contract work for local farmers.

Joe's wife Grace died in 1982. A few years later Joe suffered ill-health himself and decided to sell his farm. He bought a 2-acre life style block at Pirongia. Some happy years followed for Joe, raising young stock, pigs and laying hens. Joe was a man of many talents and his knowledge to produce a very fine "Chrüter Schnapps" brought many a Swiss friend to his door.

Old age made life difficult, with loss of hearing, visual impairment and finally lung cancer. He was fortunate only having to stay in Waikato Hospital and the Rest Home for a few days before his Creator called him back.

The funeral service for Joe Kopp took place at the Catholic Church of St. Patrick's in Te Awamutu on 11. November 2008. A good number of Swiss friends attended the funeral. During the service the Swiss National anthem was sung to the accompaniment of the accordion by Peter Ganziani, and Rinaldo Rust delivered the Eulogy. The sound of Swiss cow bells mingled with the tunes of the accordion as the hearse departed the church for private cremation. - May he rest in peace.
