Meeting opened: 2 pm

President's Report: Roland Schütz, the president, acknowledges his predecessor, Marianne Drummond - difficult to fill her footsteps! He also acknowledges the work Heidi Amelung and Trudi Brühlmann put into the Helvetia. - Then he focuses on the purpose of the emergency social welfare fund of the Swiss Society - and hopes we do not need it. The president also asks the members for ideas about how the activities of the Society could be diversified. Suggestions would be very welcome, all through the year to his address, or next year at the AGM.

Treasurer's Report: As Heidi Amelung, our treasurer, is absent, Trudi Brühlmann reads her report. Copies of the financial report are on the tables for everyone. No questions are asked. Trudi Brühlmann moves that the report be accepted; Marianne Drummond seconds it.

Delegate for the Swiss Abroad's Report: Heinz Leuenberger reads his report. He stresses the importance of being represented at the Congresses of the Swiss Abroad and hopes a successor, and deputy delegates can be found. Heinz Leuenberger moves that his report be accepted, and Marcel Rüedi seconds it.

Riflemaster's Report: Mark Kiser reports that the participation in the Cowbell Competition is about the same as in previous years. As soon as he has the results from all the clubs, he will order the medals. Mark Kiser moves that his report be accepted, and Marianne Drummond seconds it.

Election of Committee: Committee members will be appointed by the above executive as required; moved by Roland Schütz, seconded by Marianne Drummond.

Election of the Delegate and the Deputy Delegates for the Swiss Abroad: The Ambassador Dr Nobs stresses the importance of having a representative, even if New Zealand is a long way from Switzerland. He suggests that our representative could be an ad hoc representative, somebody who spends some time in Switzerland anyway and would be prepared to give the time to represent the New Zealand Swiss. He suggests to leave it open for the moment and maybe look for somebody by publishing the need in the Helvetia. This proposal is moved by the Ambassador, Dr. Beat Nobs, and seconded by Marcel Rüedi.

General Business:

Helvetia: Marcel Rüedi thanks the new Helvetia team and says their Helvetia is just as good as the Taranaki Helvetia was.

Life membership in the Society: This issue does not require a discussion or motion; it will fizzle out if subsequent Society office holders follow the example of Marianne Drummond and her team.

Club Reports

Auckland: The president of the Auckland Swiss Club, Marcel Rüedi, reports that Auckland has had a good year. The membership has grown, mainly thanks to the internet. Auckland has 62 shooters, and a membership of 142, up from 131 last year.

Hamilton: Hans Vetsch reports for Herbert Stäheli, who is in Switzerland. The Hamilton Club was very active. The membership has increased. He thanks the Auckland Club for the opportunity to shoot in Auckland. Hamilton has around 40 card players on the card evenings. The Hiking Weekend, the Picnic, the Fondue, 1st August and the Family walks are popular, too; all is going well.

Taranaki: In the absence of the president and the vice president of the Taranaki Swiss Club, Marianne Drummond congratulates the Auckland Club to the Cowbell. The Taranaki Club has 230 members, about 150 come to the functions. Marianne Drummond thanks the teams who organize Jassen, Shooting, Kegeln - and the Kitchen staff. All these contributions by members make a great club.

Wellington: The president of the Wellington Swiss Club, Roland Schütz, reports that the Cards Evenings (or afternoons) are not very well attended, but the Fondue is a hit; many young people came and had a good evening – and a good fondue, too. The next event is a film afternoon at the Army Camp. Wellington has now also a Suisse Romande in the committee. The club is in good shape – and still working towards a new roof.

Venue for the next meeting: Hans Vetsch, on behalf of the Hamilton Swiss Club, invites all Swiss Society members to Hamilton for next year's AGM to be held on Queen's Birthday Weekend.
