Sunday 10 November : SWISS CLUB EXCURSION TO RANGITOTO ISLAND

Have you ever been to Rangitoto, Auckland's landmark, some 600 years old only? You see it from everywhere – which means you get stunning views, and discover a very different perspective of Auckland. But there is more – caves to explore, easy walks, bush, birds, eerie lava fields, interesting history, old baches, opportunities to swim.

At the time of writing, the November timetable for the ferries is not out yet; the times below are provisional. You will get an email before the outing or you can also check the Swiss Club website, or phone me (Nelly) at 4794038.

We intend to meet at the Auckland and Devonport Ferry Terminals. Look for someone waving a Swiss flag at

Auckland at 9.00 for 9.15 departure (presuming current timetable will be in force still), or at Devonport at 9.10 for 9.25 departure. Unfortunately, Fuller's group discounts are meager and need to be paid in advance, so that we decided everyone will pay for their own tickets. You don't even need to book. The current price is \$28 for adults, 14 for children aged 5 to 15, free for children under five, \$25 for seniors 65 and over, and \$69 for a family of 2 adults and 2 children. The boat leaves Rangitoto Wharf for the return trip at 4pm. The trip is so short you really don't have time to get seasick.

We have several options for walks up to the top to an altitude of 259metres (a must!) and down again, and will decide on the day which one to take, possibly go in two groups. The shortest hike takes one hour up, 40 minutes down, and is easy. A detour to explore lava caves makes it more exciting. There are opportunities to swim, either in McKenzie Bay (a bit of a detour) or near Rangitoto Wharf (somewhat small swimming area).

Wear walking shoes, take all your food and drinks (no shops on the island), sunscreen and hat, a torch for the caves, a towel and togs if you like to brave the water (for the uninitiated: "Togs" is the Kiwi word for bathers (swimsuit)).

Working bee at the farm. Get it in ship-shape for the arrival of the very special guest on 08 December! Enjoy a free lunch courtesy of the club, and meet some other hard workers.

Switzerland tops field in competitiveness

Switzerland has again been named the most competitive country in the world in an annual survey released on Wednesday by the Geneva-based World Economic Forum. Singapore ranked second, Finland third, Germany fourth and the US fifth.

Switzerland's strengths lie in its innovation, its system of education, and its research institutions, as well as its superb infrastructure, transparent administration and functioning finance and job markets, WEF said.

There is room for improvement in several areas, according to the study. Swiss youths should have greater access to universities and women

should have greater access to the business world. The study also criticised the protectionism in the Swiss agricultural market.

"It is important that Switzerland shy away from overregulation and protectionism and focus on its competitive advantages," said the study's authors. WEF praised the financial and banking sectors for quickly adapting to new realities.

The study urged countries with lower rankings – such as Spain (ranked 35), Italy (49), Portugal (51) and Greece (91) – to improve access to innovation in order to address the inefficiencies and flexibility of their markets.
