I have to pull my thoughts back to New Zealand now... The committee of the Auckland Swiss Club recently had the great pleasure to meet our new


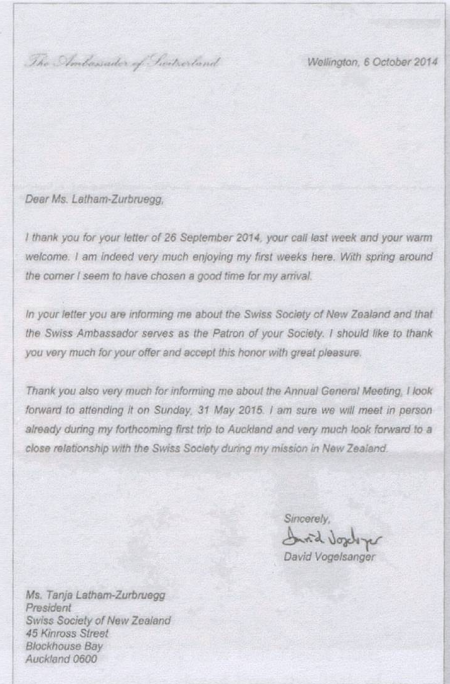
