Moved Marianne Drummond, seconded Adrian Blaser.

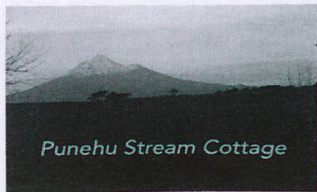
Neil pointed out that this should be clarified in the constitution for future committees.
