

I take this opportunity to extend to you all a safe and very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

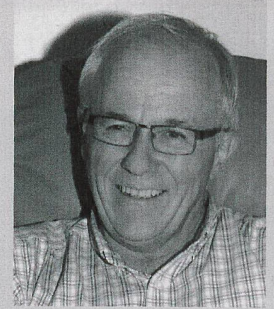
