Margaret Clark (nee Schuler)

14 April 1951 – 25 April 2019

Margaret was the youngest of four children and she spent most of her childhood growing up in the Manaia area with her brothers Alby and Werner (one sibling died in Switzerland as a baby). In 1967 she graduated from Opunake High School and went to help look after the young children of a local family.

Margaret eventually met and married Neil Clark and grew to become a woman of many talents. They were blessed with four children; Tony, Susan, Richard and Karen. She was a homemaker, truck driver, loved playing pool and did a bit of arm wrestling. She also loved drawing, cooking, gardening and absolutely adored Elvis! Margaret volunteered at the Citizen's Advice Bureau for over fifteen years, cooked for the Waiouru Army Military Camp, was a sewing teacher, a cub and scout leader and librarian at Tawhiti School in Hawera. A lady who volunteered her time and had many skills!

She loved her family and always supported her children and their families. She was a strong woman, sometimes a stubborn and determined woman, but someone with such a kind nature that she wouldn't hurt a fly.

Margaret had a strong affinity with her Swiss ancestry, and treasured her trip to Switzerland in 2006 when she saw where her parents grew up and lived. Although she was frugal, she booked the room to get the best view of the Matterhorn!!!

Margaret was a hard-working lady who was full of life, however failing health made her slow down, but she always had a smile on her face. Les, her best friend of twenty-five years looked after Margaret, with ongoing love and support from her family; four children, thirteen grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.
