ANGLO-SWISS RELATIONS.

Communicated by the Secretariat of the N.S.H.

Dr. A. Latt, professor at the Cantonal School in Zürich and former Secretary of the London Group of the N.S.H., spoke last week at the Holiday Course, organised by the University of Geneva, on the "Political and Social Relations between England and Switzerland." He also dealt extensively in his exposé with the rôle of the Swiss Colony in England. Dr. Latt emphasized particularly the great services which the forthcoming exchange of professors between English and Swiss universities—about which "The Swiss Observer" has already written—will render to the countries concerned. The lecture was very well received by the international audience for which this Holiday Course is organised.
