REPORT ON SWISS TRADE AND INDUSTRY IN 1930.

The "Swiss Federation of Commerce and Industry" has just published its annual *Report on Swiss Trade and Industry during the year 1930*. The abundance of economic facts and figures will enable an intelligent foreign reader to obtain an insight into Swiss economic conditions.

As formerly the General part of the Report contains a succinct statement about certain important questions concerning prices, commercial policy and the crisis.

Thereupon follows a statistical part containing all the most important dates from the different fields of Swiss economic conditions such as: population, agriculture, waterpower, factories, labour questions, cost of living, banking, foreign trade, finance and taxation.

The most important part of the volume is devoted to special reports on the individual branches of trade and industry, on traffic, insurance and banking, on production and distribution of electric energy and on technical and commercial education. There are new chapters concerning some industries which have so far not been dealt with.

The Report which is some 300 pages strong, appears in a French and in a German edition and may be obtained at the price of Sw.Fr. 8.— (plus postage) from the "Secretariat of the Swiss Federation of Commerce and Industry," Zurich, Börsenstrasse 17.

FOOTBALL.

SWISS CUP—THIRD ROUND.

Sunday, 13th December, was set apart for the "Swiss Cup," and the usual surprise results were not wanting. Young Fellows, second in Groupe I of the National League failed to beat Bellinzona, last but one in Groupe 6 of League II, in Zurich! The match ended 2—2, after extra time. To give the reader (if any!) a correct picture of the enormity of Bellinzona's feat, you must suppose that Arsenal could only draw with Darwin in their coming Cup match at home! As Bellinzona have just been presented with a new playground by the Municipality, it seems poetic justice for the club to show its gratitude by providing a match of such importance and against such redoubtable foes as Young Fellows, for their enthusiastic supporters to witness. Good luck, Bellinzona, the last representative of the lovely Ticino left in the cup.

Another surprise was the shattering defeat inflicted by Grasshoppers on Old Boys, 11—1. Thus they avenged their early season reverse of 1—2, paid back with compound interest! Blue Stars easily beat Kickers in Luzern 5—0, Brühl v. Basel 1—4, also rather against current form; Servette made no mistake in beating the champion First Leaguer's Lausanne-Sports 2—1, Chaux-de-Fonds accounted for Cantonal 2—0 and Young Boys beat Fribourg 1—0 away. The match Urania v. Biel was postponed to 9th January to avoid a clash with Servette's cup game.

There was only one First League fixture Black Stars v. Concordia 0—5. Concordia by virtue of their victory continue the see-saw game at the top of the table, with Brühl, who go to second place, Concordia having one point advantage.
