None of the National League results are of a startling nature, except perhaps the loss of their first point by Grasshoppers against Carouge, who incidentally picked up their first point at the fifth attempt. Grasshoppers and Young Boys are at the head of their respective groups, each with 9 points from 5 games. The Bernese are rather more convincing and have the best goal average of any team, 18 for and only 4 against. Their famous old goalie, Pulver, who kept for the Y.B. both in 1928-29 and 1922-23 i.e. the last two occasions when Y. B. pulled off the championship, apparently has lost none of his prowess and agility. Congratulations to the "evergreen."

In the First League "West," Grenchen are the only club with full marks from 5 games and have a lead of 4 points over Bern who have a game in hand, however. In "East" Locarno leads, followed by Bellinzona, Brühl, St. Gallen, Luzern, Winterthur. Old Boys have at last won a match and thereby advance from last or ninth place to eight, displacing Oerlikon.

A NEW LAKE.

There is now a new lake in Switzerland — the artificial lake on the Grimsel Pass at a height of 6,155 feet which has recently been completed and filled.

It is three and a half miles long and covers the greater part of the glen leading to the Oberaar glacier. Its maximum width is 600 yards and it is 110 yards deep.

The 300,000,000 cubic feet of water it contains will drive the turbines of three big power plants erected at different heights so as to use the same current of water at various levels. One of them, the Handeck plant, is ready; the two others at Boden and Innertkirchen will be completed within the next two years, and their aggregate production of electric power will be over 282,000-h.p.

The new lake has been created by damming the Grimsel Glen, where there were two small lakes. The old hospice erected in the fifteenth century, and partly rebuilt about 1860, was pulled down last year, and the place where it stood is now under 100 feet of water. A new hospice, a solid stone building, has been constructed on a rock buttress overlooking the lake, and it can easily accommodate over a hundred persons. The main road has also been rebuilt, and it crosses the valley on the dam which at that place is 500 feet high, 110 feet long, and 15 feet wide at the top.

A tunnel three and a quarter miles long connects the Grimsel Lake with the Gelmer Lake in the neighbouring Gelmer Valley, and from there the water directly falls towards the Handeck, where the first power plant has been constructed. These works have certainly altered the aspect of the site, but the engineers have interfered as little as possible with the mountain scenery. The lake, which existed in a prehistoric epoch, adds colour and gaiety to a site which was dark and mournful.
