FOOTBALL.

Another busy Sunday (24th January) has passed by and all the leaders in their respective Groupes have strengthened their positions.

NATIONAL LEAGUE.

In Groupe I, Basel suffered their seventh defeat at the hands of F.C Zurich 0-3, whilst their neighbours Nordstern lost to F.C. Bern 0-2 away. (That elusive Saint of Basel this time really was on strike!) Gallus too, I cannot bring myself to call him Sankt Gallus any more, must have thought a trip to Geneva most inconvenient, and so Urania found it easy to beat St. Gallen 5-0. This has landed my friends second from the bottom, a very unhealthy place to occupy.

In Groupe II. Blue Stars trounced Old Boys of Basel fame 5-0 (oh where did that Saint get to?), Grasshoppers continued their scoring feats by accounting for Etoile Chaux-de-Fonds 9-0 and Aarau did well in holding Biel to a draw 2-2.

FIRST LEAGUE.

These matches ended according to expectation: Racing-Monthey 5-0 Solothurn-Lausanne Sports 0-4, and Black Stars-Chiasso 2-1, and that is where that Basel Saint must have hovered around!

As there has not been a National League table published since the 31st October, it should be of interest to see the state of the clubs to-day. Groupe I shows hardly any change, but F.C. Bern has very much improved recently. In Groupe 2, the changes have been of a violent nature. Aarau, then leader, are now second last and Grasshoppers, then fifth, now have a clear lead over Biel.

PROMOTION AND RELEGATION.

This matter has now been officially cleared up. For this season only the National League consists of 18 clubs. In future there will be only 16 clubs in two Groupes of 8. This season therefore the two bottom clubs in their respective groupes (four in all) are relegated to League I and the respective Leaders of Groupes 1 and 2 in League I (2 in all) are promoted to the National League, and so you get your 16.

The League I consists of 18 clubs and will continue so. The three bottom clubs in each Groupe (6 in all) descend to League II, and four teams from League II join League I. In future years there will, of course, be only four relegated and four promoted.

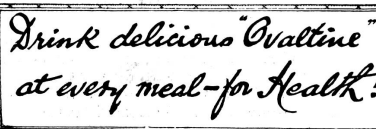
