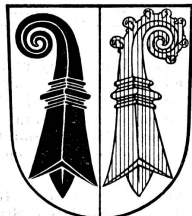
CABARET AND DANCE AT THE SWISS CLUB.

ARMS OF BASLE.



Per pale; argent, the head of a crozier in pale and to dexter sable, for Basle-City; argent, the head of a crozier in pale and to sinister gules, for Basle-Country.

The arms of Basle represent both the arms of Basle-City and Basle-Country impaled in one single escutcheon. From an early period Basle was the seat of a bishop whose arms are argent, the head of a crozier gules, the lower end terminated by three points.

The arms of Basle-City derive from the bishopric but are black instead of red, and consequent to a grievance with the episcopal office in 1380, the head of the pastoral staff was turned to dexter as a mark of dissent. The supporters of the shield of Basle-City have varied in the course of time and according to the town's history. Since the XVth century the supporter is a "cockatrice," a winged monster having the head, body, and feet of a cock, the tongue barbed, and the tail of a dragon. The presence of this chimerical animal, called "basilisk" by Swiss armorialists, tends to make those arms *parlantes*.

Basle-Country bears the arms of the chief town of Liestal, argent, a Basle crozier gules. The head of the crozier is turned to sinister and encircled externally with seven red pearls or little crozier's heads. These accessories existed on the original arms of Liestal as brisure to distinguish them from those of the bishopric. Seven in number for Basle-Country, they represent the seven insurgent rural districts of Waldenburg, Ramstein, Homburg, Farnsburg, Liestal, Münchenstein, and Birsegg who took a leading part in obtaining equality of rights from the undue authority of the city burgher parties, and leading subsequently to the formation of the two half-cantons in 1833.

The arms of Basle-Country have no supporters.
