**CIVIL AVIATION IN SWITZERLAND.**

According to the statistics of the Swiss Air Department there were 88 civil aeroplanes in use on January 1st, 1935, compared with 84 in the previous year. Of these 25 are registered for regular traffic, 61 as sports machines, and two for both kinds of employment. Of these 88 civil aeroplanes 37 were constructed in England, 18 in Switzerland, 15 in Germany, 8 in Holland, 5 in France, 4 in the United States, and 1 in Italy.

Twenty-six civil aeroplanes are stationed at Zürich-Dübendorf, 14 at Lausanne-Blecherette, 12 at Berne-Belpmoos, 11 at Geneva Cointrin, and 11 at Basle-Birsfelden. Since January 1st several new Douglas aeroplanes have been introduced by the Swissair Company, and an Autogyro machine by the Berne airport.

On April 1st a Spanish company will open a regular aeroplane service Paris-Madrid. Leaving Paris at 3.40 p.m., one reaches Madrid at 7.50 p.m. From Zürich, Basle, Lausanne and Geneva corresponding aeroplane services can be used to Paris.
