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loss — not too bad considering that the matches were played in a smoky hall by a team that is used to the freshness of the mountain air.

MONTHLY REPORT ON THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF ZURICH.

(by Leu & Co's Bank Limited, Zurich).

Zurich, April 2nd, 1935.

We may readily say, that the month of March was unfortunate since the international politic and economic development have taken a rather disappointing turn. The nations were highly shocked about Germany's blunt statement of re-armorment and it is only to be hoped, that the combined efforts of France, England and Italy to come to a satisfactory agreement with her, may not be too far off.

Other features, that kept the stock-exchange agast were the currency troubles in Belgium which ended with a legal devaluation of the Belgian Franc by 28%. It is quite comprehensible that this course is making the task harder for those countries remaining on gold. As far as Switzerland is concerned, it is well known, that the responsible authorities are continually emphasizing their will of maintaining the gold standard. The very strong financial situation of the Swiss National Bank will greatly facilitate their mutual task of doing so.

Under these blows the stock market fluctuated heavily and even the gilt-edged bonds suffered losses. The success of the Swiss Government for cheaper interest was of short duration, since the international troubles hampered also a further rise of our first securities. The average interest rate of 12 gilt-edged securities of the Swiss Government and the Federal Railways has grown since March the 10th from 4% to nearly 4½% at the end of the month. Meanwhile the downward trend seems to have halted and the final quotations are slightly above the lowest level.

The pressure on certain foreign bonds such as on Belgium and in a lesser degree on French one's was even more pronounced. Losses of 20 points are not exceptional.

For German bonds the market was easy since the German-Swiss clearing arrangement has not as yet been brought to a satisfactory end.

The share market was characterised during this month by a great uncertainty, which partly might be attributed to the belga devaluation. Especially Belgian stock such as the 6% preference shares of the Belgian Railways fluctuated considerably: 72—45½—48½.

A certain number of Swiss stock and many of the international one's profited from an increased demand, being considered safest against currency losses. Meanwhile, however, part of the gains were lost again. Such are:
