SEVERAL INTERESTING COMPARISONS.

In spite of its cheapness, Swiss people consume less bread than any other European, even less than the North American. It is estimated that the consumption of bread in Switzerland, per head of the population, is 130 kg., whereas in Germany it is 158 kg. The greatest bread eaters are the Belgians: 273 kg. per year; the French: 250 kg., the Austrians and the Italians: 175 kg., the English: 170 kg. and the citizen of the United States: 165 kg. Switzerland consumes a high percentage of food products which are dearer than bread. The average consumption of meat amounts to 41 kg. per year and per head of the population. Sugar is consumed to the extent of 30 kg., whereas Germany only consumes an average of 20 kg., France 22 kg. and Italy 5.5kg. The consumption of wine is also high. It is estimated at 50 litres per year, per inhabitant. Beer attains the annual figure of 47 litres per head of the population, against 76 litres in Germany, 80 litres in England and 190 litres in Belgium.

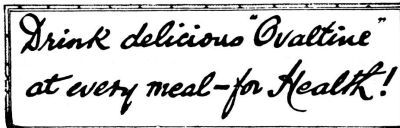
