It would not have been a complete Swiss musical evening without yodling. Mrs. A. Rossier and Mrs. B. Aebersold with Mrs. Scherrer at the piano once more provided that thrilling entertainment to the delight of the audience. — Young Niggli, eight year old Solothurner, wished to distinguish himself, so gave a solo on his accordion, winning for himself, the heartiest clap of the evening. — Miss Niederhaeuser, the yodlerin with the golden voice, known to the whole colony for this, kindly obliged with a couple of surprise numbers.

Opening the dance and, providing a delightful variation Mrs. Scherrer on the piano gave a few old English songs after which the two dance-music accordionists settled down to their task, but had to be interrupted when Mr. Schaerli, an absolute master of the Handoergely was discovered in the hall. Mr. Schaerli stepped smilingly on the platform and gave an amazing demonstration with his small instrument. — The raffle caused much fun, when elderly ladies walked across the hall to collect their prize consisting of a cigarette lighter, and men to receive ladies handbags and manœuvre sets. — Dance followed till 2 a.m.

When God Save The King was played nearly every eye swang round looking at the clock in surprise. We can but thank the Accordion Club for such an enjoyable evening and trust this will mark the first of a long series of similar evenings.
