CONTINENTAL FILMS WORTH SEEING.

London's Mecca of the Continental film world, the *Academy Cinema*, is at present presenting its patrons with "*Katia*" a very delightful picture of the more romantic order. It is a deft adaptation of Princess Bibesco's famous love-story "*Démon bleu*," telling of the infatuation of Tsar Alexander II for a wilful young lady, who after the death of the Tsarina becomes her successor, but loses her lover-emperor by an anarchist's bomb. The essential tragedy of this tale is rather overlaid by the sweet gaiety and charm both of *Katia*, most winningly interpreted by Danielle Darrieux, and the great Tsar, whom John Loder impersonates very sympathetically. André Algazy has produced an impressive picture of the late Nineteenth Century Russia, the intrigues of a dazzling Court, bitterly opposed attempts of the young Tsarina to achieve some political and social reforms. But the most satisfying passages are those depicting the gentle growth of an enduring love from light-hearted flirtation.

At the *Berkeley Cinema*, now under the same management as the *Academy*, the singing film stars Jan Kiepura and Martha Eggerth may be seen at their best in "*Zauber der Bohème*," which may justly be described as one of the last great Austrian films. The beauty of Opera is brought to the screen in this adaptation of Puccini's "*La Bohème*," combining all its pathos with some of the loveliest singing ever recorded.

The *Curzon* presents a beautiful adaptation of Henry Bernstein's famous play "*Le Bonheur*" with Charles Boyer and Gaby Morley in the leading parts. It is the phantastic story of a famous music-hall and film star who falls in love with her would-be assassin, a poor numb cartoonist, who tried to shake off his fascination for the idol of a shallow world by shooting her, but who in the end most unaccountably has sense enough to relinquish his conquest. The passing romance in the hectic atmosphere of artistic life in Paris is well told.

THE STOCK EXCHANGE OF ZURICH. (By Leu & Co.'s Bank, Limited, Zurich.)

The Czechoslovakian question being settled, our market in gilt-edged securities has improved considerably during the past month. There exists at the present time again a plethora of idle funds seeking investment in first class bonds. Many new issues are forthcoming. The new issues 3% City of Oslo at 96%, 3½% Crédit Foncier Vaudois at 100%, and 3½% Canton Neuchâtel at 94½% had all quite a remarkable success. At the present moment, two new issues are open for conversion and subscription, namely
