It may be recalled here that the Home was officially opened almost exactly four years ago, on February 22nd, 1936, when our then Minister, Monsieur C. R. Paravicini, presided at the inaugural ceremony. Madame Mimier was then elected Honorary President in grateful rememberance of her husband, the late George Dimier, through whose generous legacy was created the nucleous of the fund for the establishment of the Home; the added means required towards the realisation of this provident scheme being afforded some years later through the initiative and magnificent lead of the Unione Ticinese and the splendid response of the other Swiss societies and members of the Colony. Madame Paravicini became the first Patron of the Home.

To-day, this very worthy Institution, which in comfortable conditions and under a very efficient management houses some twelve compatriots over 70 years of age, stands out as a monument of true Swiss practical sympathy and goodwill towards less fortunate fellow-citizens.

Madame Thurnheer's kind action in giving her patronage to the Home will be particularly welcome to and appreciated by the whole Colony.
