His Grace, who is no stranger to Switzerland having spent a long holiday there after his final studies in Rome, was acquainted with the efforts of the Swiss Chaplain and the Committee and gave his full approval, promised every support and gave his blessing to the work and to all members of the Swiss Colony. He spoke highly too of the work of the Swiss Red Cross for the prisoners of war and refugees and expressed the fervent hope that Switzerland, so far almost miraculously spared from the actual horrors of war should remain the "island of Peace" in war-torn Europe.
