THE EDELWEISS CLUB.

With the feast of the Nativity only a few weeks ahead, it is appropriate to inform the Colony of the re-birth of the Rev. A. Lanfranchi's Social Club for the young Swiss in London, of either sex and not confined to adherents of any particular religion. We say re-birth, as this club, the nucleus of which Father Lanfranchi has kept going all through the war years, often under the most difficult and trying conditions, is to emerge under a new name: THE EDELWEISS CLUB and with new headquarters at TRINITY HALL, Great Portland Street, W.1.

The cessation of hostilities has made it possible to reorganise this Social Club for the benefit of all the young Swiss people in London and their friends, who wish to meet once a week in congenial company and in a nice, homely atmosphere. In fact, the appeal to enlarge the scope and the activities of the Club, has come to the Rev. A. Lanfranchi largely from the young people themselves.

Members and well-wishers will be approached personally, by a circular letter, giving fuller particulars about the programme and the aims of the Club. We would only mention, therefore, that it is intended for members and their friends to meet every Saturday, as from December 1st, from 7 — 10.30 p.m., for the purpose of Socials, Dances and Sports (Table Tennis, Bad-

minton, Darts, etc.) and it is hoped that, from time to time, it may also be possible to show some new Swiss films.

The success of the Club will depend, to a large extent, on the enthusiasm, co-operation and organising ability of the young people themselves, but the personality of Father Lanfranchi as its head, should be sufficient guarantee that a happy and patriotic spirit will prevail at all these gatherings.

For the above reasons we are happy to bring this appeal to the notice of everyone whom it may concern and we wish the Rev. A. Lanfranchi and the EDELWEISS CLUB a successful start and a very fruitful and long career.
