The programme includes preparation for the Cambridge School Certificate; for the Higher and Lower Certificates of Proficiency in English; and for English and continental Universities.

During the war the school has remained open, and it numbers at present some 60 girls, half of whom are Swiss. The English Branch, which was opened at Shrewsbury during the war, is closing in April.

As soon as Exchange Control Regulations permit, pupils from England will be received again.
