*May, 1924:* Mr. Louis Dupuis, one of the Doyens of the Swiss Colony, died in London at the age of 75.

Dr. Marc Peter, Swiss Minister at Washington, is entertained by the City Swiss Club.

"Ye Olde Members" re-union of the Union Helvetia takes place at 1, Gerrard Place, W.1. In the chair: Mr. F. H. Rohr.

Lecture by Mr. G. P. Gooch, M.A., co-editor of the *Contemporary Review* and late Chairman of the Social and Political Education League, on "The European Situation" at the "Swiss Institute."

Gymnastic Society "Schweizerbund," Gymnastic Display at 74, Charlotte Street, W.1.

*June, 1924:* Swiss Sports Meeting at Herne Hill Athletic Ground under the Chairmanship of Mr. Ch. Barbezat.

The death is announced of Mr. C. Lorleberg, a director of Messrs. R. W. Greef and Co., Ltd., at the age of 41. He was a keen and able business man, and a member of the City Swiss Club.

Monsieur W. de Bourg takes up his duties at the Swiss Legation; he was formerly First Secretary of Legation in Bucharest.

Monsieur Jaques Dalcroze is giving two lecture-demonstrations at the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley.

*July, 1924:* Death is reported of Mr. Emil Buser at the age of 66. Mr. Buser spent the best part of his life in England; he was a member of the "Commission économique Suisse" in London, and interested himself in the work carried on by the Swiss Institute, Swiss Mercantile Society and Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

Monsieur C. Rezzonico is appointed "adjoint de l'Attaché Commerciale" at the Swiss Legation in London.

*August, 1924:* First of August Celebration at Caxton Mall, Westminster, in the presence of the Swiss Minister, Monsieur C. R. Paravicini.

*September, 1924:* Dr. Ernest Wetter, chief of the "Division du Commerce" of the "Department Fédéral de l'Economie Public" is the guest of the City Swiss Club at a dinner held at the Brent Bridge Hotel, Hendon.

Death occurred in London of Mr. John Walter Sterchi, Chancellor at the Swiss Legation, at the age of thirty. Mr. Sterchi, who was born in Sumiswald (Ct. Berne) in 1894, was appointed Chancellor of the Swiss Legation in London in 1915, and enjoyed great popularity in the Swiss Colony.

*October, 1924:* Visit of the well-known *double quartette* "Fidelio" of Zurich; they were entertained by the Swiss Choral Society.

The Swiss Minister, on behalf of the London Colony, presents a large silver cup for competition at the Centenary of the "Tir Fédéral" which is taking place at Aarau.

*November, 1924:* Lecture at the "Swiss Institute" by Mr. P. M. Short, B.Sc., on "Socialism"; in the chair: Mr. W. Beckmann, President.

Mr. J. R. Goetz died at the age of 81; he was a notable member of the Swiss Colony, and a former President of the City Swiss Club. He took a most active part in all matters of the Colony.

Mr. Th. Schaeerer, who for the last four years had been working in connection with one of the leading

architects in the City, starts business on his own account as architect and surveyor at 11, Dacre Street, Westminster, S.W.1.

Union Helvetia, Annual Banquet and Ball at 1, Gerrard Place, W.1. In the chair: Monsieur C. R. Paravicini, Swiss Minister. (President: Mr. P. Lehrhan.)

*December, 1924:* Exhibition of Swiss coloured prints at the Gallery of the Alpine Club, 23, Saville Row, W.1. Exhibits are shown of the period between 1770 and 1820, representing works by Alberli, Freudenberger, Koenig, Lorg, Sprunglin and other famous painters of this time.
