Olympic Winter Games St. Moritz.

Closing day for the entries to the Olympic Winter Games was November 30th. Until this date the Swiss Olympic Committee was informed of the following participations:—

Ice-Hockey, 11 nations:— Canada, America, Austria, France, Great Britain, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Sweden, Czechoslovakia and Switzerland.

At the last moment an unfortunate discussion has been started about the fate of the Ice-Hockey competitions during the Olympic Games. The American Olympic Committee has announced the participation of

a team of the A.A.U. which is not a member of the I.I.H.A. (International Ice-Hockey Association) whereas the entry of a team of the A.I.H.A. (American Ice-Hockey Association) was refused. According to international rules, however, only teams belonging to the I.I.H.A. can compete in the Olympic Games for Ice-Hockey, so that the entry of the A.A.U. protected by the American Olympic Committee cannot be accepted. A meeting of the International Ice-Hockey Association in the next few days will decide whether the Olympic Games can possibly be held without the Americans taking part.

Many foreign teams are already in St. Moritz in order to get acquainted with the conditions of life in Switzerland and with the race courses.

Roller Skating.

America organised for the first time in history the world championship for roller skating. The meeting took place in the roller skating rink at Washington and ended with some surprising performances of the Swiss competitors. The world championship for ladies was won by Ursula Wehrli, Zurich (Swiss champion) whereas Karl Peter (Zurich) was runner up in the championship for men. In the pair-skating competition, Karl Peter and Gritli Müller (Zurich-Basel) finished third.

Gymnastics.

The Swiss national gymnastic team met an Italian side in an international competition at Geneva. The Swiss scored a not unexpected victory. The first 7 places in the final classification were taken by the Swiss competitors of whom J. Stalder, Lucerne, acquired the 1st place, followed by W. Lehmann and Ch. Kipfer. Although the Italian athletes had not the same standard, they put up a fine fight and held the contest open until the very end.

Skiing.

The Swiss army has called 7 military patrols to a special training in La Bretaye in order to make the necessary preparations and elections for the Olympic Games. The first training race was started over a distance of 12 km. with an ascent of 590 m. Winner was the patrol of Oblt. Louis Wuilloud (Wm. M. Müller, Gfr. Borghi, Gfr. Vouardoux) followed by patrol Oblt. R. Zurbriggen, Saas-Fee, and patrol Oblt. H. Pieren, Adelboden. The second training which will be held at the end of December will lead to the final eliminations and to the decision which patrols shall represent Switzerland in St. Moritz.

Football.

The championship in the National League A and B as well as in the lower leagues is carried a stage further. Only two Sundays are left in order to designate the winter champions. The situation in the table of the lower leagues (1st league) is the following:—
