C. F. RAMUZ †.

A figure of great distinction in our country has passed away, in the person of C. F. Ramuz. He died at a clinic in Lausanne after an operation. He was in his 69th year.

Ramuz was a prolific novelist, poet, critic and essayist.

Born in 1878 in the canton of Vaud, he lived there for almost the whole of his life, except only for the years he spent in Paris before the war of 1914.

Amongst his better known novels are: "Passage du Poète," "Beauté sur la Terre," "La guerre dans le Haut-Pays" a story of the French Revolution, "Si le Soleil ne revenait pas," and "Présence de la Mort."

Ramuz had been living in relative seclusion for many years before his death in a village near Lausanne.
