Dear Sir,

Regarding the letter reproduced in your last issue on the subject of the recent Anglo-Swiss agreements on trade, finance and tourisme for 1948, I am very glad to hear that, as on previous occasions, you intend to publish for the benefit of your readers, a résumé on the talks which Dr. V. Umbricht and M. Charly Weibel will give at the Monthly Meeting of the Swiss Mercantile Society of March 10th, when my colleagues will deal fully with the background, as well as with the results, of the recent negotiations on relations between Switzerland and the sterling area.

As to your correspondent's question on the relative importance of tourisme within Switzerland's economic

structure, I would thus only say that Switzerland's income from foreign tourist traffic was estimated, in 1937, at a figure equal to about 36% of total Swiss exports.

May I thus leave the matter for the moment as it stands, it being, of course, understood that the Legation remains at the entire disposal for any further information.
