Messrs. F. Streit and E. M. Huber volunteered to act as Delegates. The Society was also invited to make a monetary contribution towards the expenses of this sporting event, which is in the nature of a family gathering. Mr. A. Rueff proposed that the Society make a donation of £5. This was seconded by Mr. H. J. Hobbins and passed by Members present.

The Vice-President, Mr. W. Burren, who has taken a very active part in the London Swiss Sports in the past, explained the object of this sports' meeting, and he emphasized that *all* members and their families would be most welcome to join in the fun at Herne Hill. It was suggested by one of the Members that some of the "heavy-weights" of the Society should form a team to take part in the tug-of-war, but no committee was formed to organise this!

The President again drew Members' attention to the recently formed Anglo-Swiss Society whose objects and aims are well-known. Several fellow-members have already joined this Society.

At the end of the meeting the Secretary, Mr. E. A. Gotz, introduced the Guest of the evening, Mr. W. A. ROLFE, who gave a display of *Newfoundland* stamps.

The President, in a few well-chosen words, expressed to our Visitor the Members' great appreciation of an outstanding exhibition and this was fully endorsed with a hearty applause by all.
