## **NEWS AT RANDOM**

Federal

During the month of September, 1952, the Swiss Federal Railways, carried 19.08 million passengers, 564,000 more

than during the same period in 1951. Receipts: 28.01 million francs. (September, 1951: 25.89 million frs.)

Goods traffic carried amounted to 1,64 million tons, 105,000 tons less than in September, 1951. (Receipts: 33.95 million francs).
